

# OSHA SAFETY CLASSES REGISTRATION FORM

## ASBESTOS ALLIED TRADE/RESTRICTED HANDLER

- Electricians may need to disturb asbestos in order to do their specific job. It is a requirement of the Departments of Labor, Health and Environmental Protection that Local, City and State agencies license workers as Allied Trade Restricted Asbestos Handlers before they perform this type of work.
- The license is limited to special tasks for auxiliary asbestos projects. If the work being performed during the course of a job accidentally disturbs asbestos, the worker would be required to show proof of certification as having had completed mandatory training from an approved training entity.
- This course includes instruction in Respiratory Protection procedures.

## ASBESTOS HANDLER

- In compliance with the Departments of Labor, Health and Environmental Protection Departments, any electrician removing, encapsulating or disturbing, repairing or enclosing any asbestos containing materials must possess, at all times, Asbestos Handler certification by an approved training entity and must be licensed by Local, City and State agencies.
- This course includes instruction in Respiratory Protection procedures. Reviews Personal Protective Equipment and Medical Surveillance instruction, work practice procedures and removal.

## HAZARD COMMUNICATIONS

- This course is a mandatory course required by the Occupational Safety & Health Administration, which defines OSHA Hazard Standard regulations with a clear guide to Hazard Communications.
- The course provides information on types of chemical hazards, and instruction in identifying hazardous substances, and the use of Material Safety Data Sheets site specifics.
- This course includes instruction in Respiratory Protection procedures. Reviews Personal Protective Equipment and Medical Surveillance instruction, work practice procedures and proper disposal of hazardous substances.

## LEAD ABATEMENT

- This course is a mandatory course required by the Occupational Safety & Health Administration when working near lead. The course reviews all standards and safety regulations to be applied when working with lead based materials.
- Explains monitoring, exposure assessments, and valuable hygiene, and house keeping instructions to safeguard against lead exposure and its aftermath.
- Reviews Personal Protective Equipment and Medical Surveillance instruction, work practice procedures and removal.
- This course includes instruction in Respiratory Protection procedures.

## CONFINED SPACE

- This is an OSHA mandatory training course required by any one working in a manhole, in tunnel areas, or in some types of electrical closets, or equivalent spaces defined by OSHA as confined space.
- This course outlines the rules and responsibilities for entry level Supervisors, attendants and entrants. You will be instructed in identifying permissible spaces, entry situations and emergencies, as well as, monitoring and identifying hazardous atmospheres.

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## RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

- This course is a mandatory course required by the Occupational Safety & Health Administration.
- The class explains the importance of Respiratory Protection
- It outlines Local, State, and Federal regulations
- Information is given regarding the routes of entry of hazardous substances, the limitation of half-face use, and the proper fit requirements for greater protection.

## TUBERCULOSIS/BLOOD BORNE PATHOGENS

Since the danger of AIDS and Hepatitis B is a real concern to people in all professions, OSHA requires a mandatory training program in the study of Blood Borne pathogens.

- The N.Y.S. Department of Health requires training in Respiratory Protection and the proper use of regulated Personal Protection equipment and Medical Surveillance. The use of this equipment is mandatory while working in certain areas of hospital facilities, correctional facilities, homeless shelters, nursing homes, and ambulatory care centers.
- While OSHA is in the process of approving TB standards, the N.Y.S. Department of Health does have an enforcement policy that affects employees in health care settings, prisons, homeless shelters, long term care facilities for the elderly, and drug treatment centers.

As outlined in October 1993 regulations, the general duty clause of the Occupational Safety and Health Act stipulates employers may be cited if they fail to adequately protect workers who become exposed to tuberculosis during the course of employment.

- The course offers information on the HBV vaccine.
- Training is offered on the ways to recognize exposure on all job sites.
- Explains the requirements for employee training and emergency procedures.
- The course provides information on ways to protect yourself and your family.

To register for classes, check off the requested class and complete the following information. Your name will be placed on a pending list for future classes, and according to the date the Educational and Cultural Trust Fund office has received your request. You will be required to complete an annual medical exam before attending any classes, which require the use of a Respiratory Protection mask.
