It Is Never Too Late to Obtain a High School Diploma

For over 50 years Local Union No. 3 has recognized the importance of a high school education and a high school diploma.

To assist Local Union No. 3 members and their families to study for and take the G.E.D. exam, the Educational and CulturalTrust Fund sponsors preparation classes at the Electric Industry Center in Flushing, NY. A Licensed professional teacher conducts the classes onTuesday andThursday evenings from 5-7 P.M.

We encourage members and their immediate family members to participate in this vital course. It can have a very positive impact on jobs and economic advancements.

Two recent studies have shown that there is evidence that employers may use the G.E.D. as a signal of productive attributes in a pool of dropouts, choosing to hire G.E.D. holders over dropouts who never obtain their G.E.D. diplomas. The central finding of this study is that the earnings of G.E.D. candidates who successfully obtain a G.E.D. grow faster in the years after the G.E.D. attempt than did the earnings of unsuccessful candidates. The results indicate that successful candidates are expected to earn from 13% to 20% more than comparable G.E.D. candidates who did not obtain their diploma. -Excerpt from article*
